Feral Kittens Saved by Compassionate UPS Driver *Driver Notches Life-Saving Pick-Up While Making Deliveries*

Two five-week-old female kittens who were rescued in Roxbury on the eve of Winter Storm Grayson by a UPS driver are on the mend tonight at the Animal Rescue League of Boston's (ARL) Dedham Animal Care and Adoption Center.

While making deliveries, the driver noticed the kittens clawing at a doorstep in a desperate effort to get out of the cold. The heart-tugging sight of these kittens compelled the driver to contact ARL Rescue Services, who responded, scooped up the kittens and transported them to ARL's Dedham facility.

The kittens named "Lou Lou" and "Ladybug" were thin, dehydrated, cold, and hungry. Not surprisingly after being in the cold, the kittens also have upper respiratory infections, which are being treated with antibiotics.

Lou Lou and Ladybug will spend a few weeks in foster care to heal and put on some weight and will then be made available to find a loving forever home.
