## **ARL-Boston Rescuing 60 “Sunshine Kittens”** *Media Invited to Arrival at Logan*

The Animal Rescue League of Boston (ARL) will be getting a special delivery at Logan International Airport Tuesday afternoon – a transport of 60 kittens from Peggy Adams Animal Rescue League, a nonprofit organization based in Palm Beach, Florida. The kittens are traveling to Boston in first class style by flying on a private jet.

Animal rescue organizations from New Hampshire, Maine, and Rhode Island will also be receiving kittens; in total, Peggy Adams is transporting 129 kittens.

Thanks to affordable and accessible spay and neuter programs, there is a shortage of kittens in Massachusetts. Unfortunately in some southern states the number of homeless animals is frightening, and organizations like Peggy Adams are simply overwhelmed. This transport allows ARL to fulfill some of the demand for kittens locally, while allowing Peggy Adams to free up some space in their shelter to continue their important work.
