ARL Transporting 10 Puerto Rican Pups in Style

New arrivals to enjoy comfort of ARL's new Transport Waggin'

This afternoon, 10 adorable Sato puppies from Puerto Rico will take the last leg of their long journey in the Animal Rescue League of Boston's (ARL) brand-new Transport Waggin'. This will be the first large-scale puppy transport for the vehicle.

The transport continues the two-year partnership with All Sato Rescue, a nonprofit organization dedicated to reducing the large number of abandoned dogs in the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico. Once at ARL's Boston shelter, the pups will be quarantined for 48-hours, and once medically cleared will be available to find their forever homes.

Commissioned in late 2018, ARL's Transport Waggin' provides a host of services including: transferring ARL animals between shelters; assisting ARL Law Enforcement and Rescue Services; assisting municipal shelters and agencies without transport capabilities; and increase ability for out-of-state-transports.

In addition to the influx of the 10 Puerto Rico sato puppies, ARL also receives monthly puppy transports from North Carolina, another area of the country that unfortunately is plagued by shelter overcrowding.

These transports are vital for a number of reasons, first and foremost, to save the lives of these animals and give them a second chance. Additionally, there is a great need for young dogs in our area and ARL is grateful for the opportunity help fill this need and to extend its reach beyond the Commonwealth to help animals in need.
