ARL Brewster Honors Chatham Resident
Connie Lacaillade Receives “Champion for Animals” Award

The Animal Rescue League of Boston (ARL) recently honored Chatham resident Connie Lacaillade during a donor event at the Lacaillade home in Chatham.

The event highlighted ARL’s ongoing work on Cape Cod which includes pet adoption, spay/neuter initiatives, rabies clinics, law enforcement and field services efforts to help animals in need and to combat animal abuse and neglect. ARL has been serving Cape Cod since 1921.

The evening was capped with recognizing the event host. Connie received ARL’s “Champion for Animals” award, which is given annually to a person who goes above and beyond to make meaningful impacts for animals in need. Recent recipients of the award include Eastham resident Katrina Boucher, and Massachusetts State Senator Mark Montigny.

In 2018, Connie and her husband Peter generously funded the purchase of ARL’s Transport Waggin’, a vehicle linking ARL’s Boston, Brewster and Dedham shelters together and also serves municipalities throughout Massachusetts and animal owners in our surrounding communities.

Connie and Peter have been ARL supporters for a number of years and are passionate in ARL’s mission to be an unwavering champion for animals in need, keeping them safe and healthy in habitats and homes.
