ARL to Testify Before Joint Committee

Host of animal-related bills up for discussion

On Tuesday, the Joint Committee on Environment, Natural Resources and Agriculture will convene to hear testimony on nearly two dozen bills, including a number of animal protection bills. The Animal Rescue League of Boston (ARL) will be providing testimony on several of these legislative proposals.

The public hearing will take place at the Massachusetts State House Tuesday, September 10, from 10-1, in Hearing Room A-2.

ARL will be providing formal testimony on three bills that are part of the organization's current legislative agenda and include:

- [H.757 An Act to Study the Health of the Blue Hills Forest](#)
- [S.501 An Act to Provide Additional Funding for Animal Welfare and Safety Programming](#)
- H.812/H.3603/S.510 An Act Protecting Dogs at Boarding Kennels and Daycare Facilities (ARL will provide case studies where animals were injured or killed due to a lack of kennel regulatory standards)

With more than 90 animal-related bills filed for this legislative session, this hearing is critical to help move these important animal protection bills forward in the legislative process.
