ARL Food Drive to Help Boston's Homeless Cats

Donations accepted at ARL's Boston Shelter

This coming weekend, the Animal Rescue League of Boston (ARL) will be hosting a food drive to help feed homeless cats in the City of Boston.

From Friday, January 17 to Sunday, January 19, ARL's Boston Animal Care and Adoption Center, located at 10 Chandler St. in Boston's South End, will be accepting unopened wet or dry food.

Donations can be dropped off in the main lobby from 8:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m.

All donations will help feed hundreds of homeless and vulnerable cats in the community during the harsh winter months.
