**Chatham Orpheum to Host Special Film Screening**

*Human/animal bond film to be followed by panel discussion*

On Thursday, August 18, the Chatham Orpheum Theater will host the showing of a special documentary highlighting the human/animal bond and panel discussion, with proceeds benefitting the Animal Rescue League of Boston's (ARL) Brewster Animal Care and Adoption Center.

Tickets for the special event are \$20.

The screening of "The Way Home" will begin at 7 p.m., and will be followed by a panel discussion about the human/animal bond with a number of special guests including Dr. Edward Schettino (ARL President and CEO), Stephen Xiarhos (Barnstable 5<sup>th</sup> District State Representative), Derek Hill (Former Marine Corps Forces Special Operations), Peter McClelland (Yarmouth K9 Officer), Sarah McCracken (Executive Director of Dogs for Better Lives), and Kat Pannill (WE CAN Development Manager).
