## **Puppy from Mississippi Cruelty Case Ready for Adoption**

Puppy weighed just 12 pounds when rescued

The Animal Rescue League of Boston (ARL) is ready to find a home for a resilient puppy who was recently transported to the organization from a shelter in Mississippi after suffering from neglect.

ARL invites members of the media to meet this amazing puppy, learn more about his story and how ARL's efforts to help local animals increases its capacity to care for animals from other areas of the country where shelter overcrowding is common.

Nutella, an 11-month-old mixed-breed puppy, was rescued from a property in Mississippi in early February along with seven other dogs. He was living in unsanitary conditions, was severely dehydrated and malnourished, weighing just 12 pounds. The owner of the dogs was charged with cruelty to animals.

The neglect and malnourishment he endured greatly stunted his growth and required him to be placed on a refeeding plan to gain weight safely and slowly. When he was healthy enough to be moved, he was brought to ARL as part of a transport of dogs through the ASPCA's Animal Relocation Program.

Nutella, who now weighs over 20 pounds, will be neutered and receive intense dental care before being made available for adoption. ARL is honored to help this young dog heal and find the home and life he deserves.

ARL has the space for Nutella and other transport animals thanks to the organization's long list of community resources to help keep local pets out of shelters and in homes with the people who love them. By keeping the shelter population low, ARL is able to extend its reach to give these animals a second chance and also helping decrease shelter overcrowding in other regions of the country.
