Handful of Rottweiler Puppies Available for Adoption at Animal Rescue League of Boston

Puppies came to ARL through Healthy Moms, Happy Litters Program

Five Rottweiler puppies will be made available today at the Animal Rescue League of Boston's (ARL) Boston Animal Care & Adoption Center, and came to the organization through a special and complimentary program to help pet owners with an unplanned litter of puppies or kittens.

The nine-week-old puppies include two females and three males, and were brought to ARL earlier this week through the Healthy Moms, Happy Litters Program. This community-based program, available at all three ARL Animal Care and Adoption Centers, offers free spay/neuter services and vaccinations for the parent animals, who are returned to their caretakers, and waived surrender fees for the puppies or kittens who will receive spay/neuter, vaccinations, and be placed up for adoption.

The Rottweiler puppies are incredibly adorable and friendly and will be made available for adoption this afternoon. ARL reminds the public that adoption is a first-come-first-serve process, so anyone interested in adopting one of these puppies is encouraged to arrive before the Boston Animal Care & Adoption Center opens at 1 p.m. today.
