Mom Shares Tender Moment with Puppy Before Adoption

Two-year-old dog transported to ARL with litter of seven puppies

On this Mother's Day, the Animal Rescue League of Boston (ARL) wanted to share a special moment between a mother and her offspring at the organization's Boston Animal Care & Adoption Center.

Trixie, a two-year-old Border Collie-mix, was transported to ARL from an overcrowded shelter in Mississippi, along with her seven, eight-week-old puppies. The puppies had already been weaned from Trixie, but, when one of her puppies, named Ducky, was brought into Boston by his foster parent, it was the perfect opportunity to reunite mom and son.

The pair met up in Boston's spacious play yard, paused for a tender moment, and then enjoyed some play time together!

While Trixie and Ducky have both been adopted, several of Trixie's puppies are still awaiting their new homes and are currently available for adoption at ARL's Dedham and Brewster Animal Care & Adoption Centers.
