ARL Assists St. Louis Shelter Following Devastating Tornado

Six dogs transported to Brewster Animal Care & Adoption Center

The Animal Rescue League of Boston (ARL) is assisting an overcrowded animal shelter in St. Louis, MO, a community still reeling in the wake of a major tornado in mid-May, by taking in dogs which will free up kennel space for animals directly impacted by the storm.

ARL invites members of the media to its Brewster Animal Care & Adoption Center to meet the dogs and learn more about why these types of transports are vital during times of emergency.

The dogs were transported from Care STL, and the majority of the dogs had been available for adoption for several months.

The animals are healthy, spayed/neutered and are ready to begin the next chapter of their lives and will be available for adoption at ARL's Brewster Animal Care & Adoption Center in the next few days.

While ARL's focus is being a resource for our local communities, the organization is always honored and ready to collaborate with our national partners in times of crisis to help animals in need.

In addition to the transport of these dogs, later this week ARL is assisting another national partner by taking in four cats who were removed from an animal cruelty situation in Ohio. The cats will be transported to ARL's Dedham Animal Care & Adoption Center and once medically evaluated will be made available for adoption.
